As most of you know, the Durham Coliseum Committee has worked diligently over the past 3 years to raise nearly \$900,000.00 to renovate the track & field facility. During the summer of 2014, enough money was raised to install a brand new all-weather track, new sod and irrigation for the soccer and football field, concrete sidewalks, as well as perimeter fencing. The renovations resulted in a greatly improved facility.

For some of you, this is how the Durham High School stadium has always looked. However, not long ago, student athletes and spectators endured extremely muddy conditions during football and soccer seasons, as well as severe dust conditions during track season.



It was the generosity and hard work of many of our community members that made this dream of a renovated stadium a reality. Not only was the project 100% community funded, it was the donation of expertise and time, that allowed the Coliseum Committee to save over \$200,000.00 in project costs.



The Coliseum Committee is thrilled to announce plans to move forward with Phase II of the Durham Coliseum renovation. Phase II consists of a new Concession/Snack bar/Restroom building, as well as additional concrete work surrounding the building and entrance to the Coliseum.
