GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Successful completion of all mandated course requirements – state and district
- 230 minimum – 4 years English/3 years science/3 years math
- Must complete the Integrated Math I - state requirement – Ds and Fs don't count if college bound

TRANSCRIPT

A transcript is a “resume” or a paper trail of your work and knowledge that you gain during your high school career.

This is how you will “present” yourself to the next step, be it the military, a job or career, a trade or technical school, a community college, or a 4 year university or college.

A transcript is how you “compete” with the world for your next opportunity!

COLLEGE AND CAREER INDICATOR

- **The Standards CCI Model currently contains the following measures:**

- ✓ AP exam results
- ✓ CAASPP English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics
- ✓ a-g completion – series of classes required to be eligible for CSU and UC colleges
- ✓ Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway completion - 2 or more courses in sequence
- ✓ State Seal of Bi-literacy – 2.0 in ELA; CAASPP ELA Met or Exceeded; AP exam in Foreign Language; 4 year course of study in World Language with a 3.0 or higher
- ✓ Dual Enrollment

Important Changes for 2021/2022

Students cannot TA (including Academic tutor, cross tutor, library, kitchen or office assistant) until Junior or Senior year. When eligible to TA, it can only be for 1 period per year. (*Classes without content are not looked favorably by colleges*).

- All Butte College courses need to be taken outside of the school day. (They will not count toward graduation). (Dual credit is the exception).

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PATHWAYS

- Pathway connects high school coursework to community college pathways in order to move students into career opportunities they value or are economically needed.
 - Agriculture – FFA
 - Agriculture science pathway
 - Agriculture Floral Design
 - Agriculture – Agriculture Mechanics
 - Manufacturing – Skills USA
 - Welding and Materials Joining Manufacturing
 - Solidworks – 3 D printing and computer aided design
 - Graphic Production Technology
 - Exploring Career Technical Education
 - Arts, Media, and Entertainment – RAP – digital music production

SOUTHERN OREGON UNIVERSITY DUAL ENROLLMENT QUARTER CREDITS

Dual credit with a university while in high school is rare and is a great opportunity to gain college credit at the same time as high school credit. The student is building a college transcript separate from their high school records.

The financial advantage of cost, housing, and food is obvious but the other advantage is taking the class while at home and with instructors and classmates with whom you are comfortable.

Upon completing a SOU course, the confidence is obvious which inspires the student to add additional courses and possibly enroll in a college where they otherwise may not.
