GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Successful completion of all mandated course requirements – state and district
- 230 minimum – 4 years English/3 years science/3 years math
- Must complete Integrated Math I - state requirement – Ds and Fs don't count if college bound

OTHER THINGS TO KNOW

- CSU/UC Requirements

- ✓ a-g required courses to qualify for enrollment in a CSU or UC college directly from high school – 15 total minimum – grades of D and F do not qualify

- CTE Pathway

- ✓ Defines the educational plan for entry to community college or fast-track to career skills

- Southern Oregon University Courses

- ✓ Carry some qualification
- ✓ Class placement dependent on MAP scores, grades, teacher recommendation, state test score (when available)

COLLEGE AND CAREER INDICATOR

- **The Standards CCI Model currently contains the following measures:**

- ✓ AP exam results
- ✓ CAASPP English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics
- ✓ a-g completion – series of classes required to be eligible for CSU and UC colleges
- ✓ Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway completion - 2 or more courses in sequence
- ✓ State Seal of Bi-literacy – 2.0 in ELA; CAASPP ELA Met or Exceeded; AP exam in Foreign Language; 4 year course of study in World Language with a 3.0 or higher
- ✓ Dual Enrollment

CTE PATHWAY COMPLETION

- A series of courses in an industry sector coordinated with industry and community colleges to build skills and gain a head-start on community college classes or career
- In order to complete a pathway a student needs to take the courses in sequence and complete the capstone or top course
- Credit with Butte College can be earned or industry certifications or endorsements
- Students can be placed in job internships or job shadowing
- Completing a pathway indicates career or college readiness

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PATHWAYS

- Pathway connects high school coursework to community college pathways in order to move students into career opportunities they value or are economically needed.
 - Agriculture - Agriculture science pathway – dual credit w/Butte
 - Agriculture – Floral Design – dual credit with Butte
 - Agriculture – Agriculture Mechanics – variety of hands-on skill building
 - Manufacturing – Welding and Materials Joining - dual credit w/Butte
 - Manufacturing – Solidworks – 3 D printing and computer aided design
 - Manufacturing – Graphic Production Technology dual credit pending w/Butte
 - Exploring Career Technical Education – dual credit established
 - Arts, Media, and Entertainment - Professional Music – digital music production

SOUTHERN OREGON UNIVERSITY DUAL ENROLLMENT QUARTER CREDITS

Dual credit with a university while in high school is rare and is a great opportunity to gain college credit at the same time as high school credit. The student is building a college transcript separate from their high school records.

The financial advantage of cost, housing, and food is obvious but the other advantage is taking the class while at home and with instructors and classmates with whom you are comfortable.

Upon completing a SOU course, the confidence is obvious which inspires the student to add additional courses and possibly enroll in a college where they otherwise may not.

 - Band member – you must have been enrolled in band previously or you can audition
- Fill in all blank lines and boxes – signatures from teachers and staff (if required)
- Alternative choices
 - If no alternatives are listed, an alternative class will be selected by staff
 - Alternatives **MUST** be different than first choice classes
